2. Read Colossians 3:2–8 and 1 Peter 2:24. How should the way God kills the consequence and power of sin in your life motivate you to kill any ongoing acts of sin in your life?

3. Read Deuteronomy 7:7–9 and Colossians 3:9–10. Why is promise keeping such an important expression of God's love to His children?

a. In what ways can an extreme commitment to keeping your word, even at great personal cost, reflect God's covenant-keeping love?

4. Read Romans 5:1–2 and Ephesians 2:17–18. How does the presence of peace accurately convey what God's love means for those who were previously his enemy?

a. Read Philippians 4:4–7. As Christians, the peace of God is not something we experience only at salvation but constantly throughout our lives. What reminders can you pinpoint in this verse to help you take hold of the peace God promises his children?
