1. Write one observation or application you took away from this sermon.
2. Read 1 Peter 2:13–17 and Titus 3:1–6. How do these scriptures describe God's attitude toward authority? How does a biblical view of authority often clash with the world's idea of authority? What can you do to better adhere to the bibles' attitude toward authority this week?
3. Read Luke 2:41–52 and Proverbs 19:26–27. If there were ever an exception to disobeying parents, it would have been in Luke 2. How do these verses indicate God's view of Childhood obedience, even in the life of Christ? What situations do you often notice your child not obeying (or if you have no children, what areas do you notice society approving childhood disobedience)? How do these verses help equip you to help your children see obedience as a godly attribute?
4. Read 1 Peter 1:13–17 and Romans 16:25–26. Since every believer is a child of God, how can you use your own obedience to God as a tool to lead your children to understand the place and nature of obedience in the home and in relationship to God?
