1 Peter 2:2-9

Like newborn infants, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation— 3 if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. 4 As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, 5 you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 6 For it stands in Scripture: “Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.” 7 So the honor is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe, “The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,” 8 and “A stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense.” They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. 9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 2. Read Colossians 1:9–10. What are some accountability strategies you can use or have used to make sure that your circle is reading your Bibles Daily? Share some testimonies of how the simple act of daily Bible reading has transformed and matured other areas of your life?
3. Read 2 Peter 3:17–18. Why is progressively growing in your faith necessary as a believer? What are some dangers of not continually growing in your faith?
4. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17–6:1. Just as Israel in the Old Testament spent much of their time in worship recounting the triumphs of God, why is proclaiming the greatness of God (especially Christ' salvific triumph) paramount for anyone who truly calls themselves a Christian?
